UNPLUGGED CEREMONIES

A simple way to be fully present

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Weddings have changed.

Phones are always with us.

Moments are often seen through screens.

And without even realising it, it can take us away from what is actually happening right in front of us.

Your ceremony is one of those moments.

It's not just something to watch.

It's something to be part of.

WHAT IS AN UNPLUGGED CEREMONY?

An unplugged ceremony is a simple request.

That during the ceremony, guests put away their phones, cameras, and devices.

Not because photos aren't important.

But because presence is.

WHY COUPLES CHOOSE THIS

To be fully present

There is something powerful about looking out and seeing people... not screens.

Eye contact.

Smiles.

Real connection.

Not a row of phones held up between you and the people you care about.

To protect the moment

Some moments only happen once.

Walking down the aisle.

That first look.

The moment you see each other and everything else falls away.

These moments don't need to be shared instantly.

They deserve to be experienced first.

To allow the photographer to do their job

You've chosen a professional for a reason.

When guests step into aisles or hold up phones, it can:

- block key moments
- distract attention
- affect the quality of your photos

Once a moment is missed, it can't be recreated.

HOW TO MAKE IT WORK

This isn't about rules.

It's about how you ask.

The tone matters.

Ask clearly, but kindly

Guests take photos because they care.

So, the request should feel like an invitation, not a demand.

Say it in a way that feels like you

This can be:

- a small note in your ceremony program
- a sign at the entrance
- or a few words spoken at the beginning of the ceremony

As your celebrant, I can guide this moment and say it in a way that feels natural and respectful.

Reassure your guests

Let them know they won't miss out.

Your professional photographer will capture the ceremony,
and those images can be shared afterwards.

This helps guests relax and stay present, rather than feeling like they need to capture it themselves.

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A FINAL THOUGHT

An unplugged ceremony isn't about taking something away.

It's about giving something back.

Space.

Connection.

Presence.

The chance to experience the moment, as it happens.
